<i>Federal Appellate Litigation Clinic</i>	Representation to appellants in immigration appeals, habeas corpus proceedings, prisoner litigation, or similar matters pending in the US Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit.	Prof. Mary Levy	2 credits pass/fail clinic and 2 credit graded seminar.	3L and 4LE students only	Avg. 10-12 hours/wk including seminar. <i>Low Income Taxpayer Clinic (LITC)</i>	Direct representation of taxpayers under IRS audit; those contesting or are unable to pay tax amount proposed by the IRS; and with cases before the U.S. Tax Court. Also includes education and outreach to low-income individuals and those that speak English as a second language and systemic advocacy projects.	Prof. Andrew Weiner	4 credit graded course.	None. <i>Social Justice Lawyering Clinic</i>	Individual representation of low-income clients in civil cases affecting economic security (e.g., employment, housing, consumer) and systemic advocacy projects in collaboration with community and legal organizations, on behalf of underserved communities (e.g., immigrant rights, workers' rights, access to justice).
