APPLICATION - SPRING 2025

Temple Law School is proud to offer the State Judicial Clerkship Honors Program. In this three-credit experiential program, second-year day and third-year evening/part-time students are offered an opportunity to work for a judge in the First Judicial District of the Court of Common Pleas of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Students are educated on the structure, function, administration, and diversity of issues presented in the state judiciary, and gain practical experience with the various divisions in the First Judicial District. Working with the judges and their full-time clerks, students draft orders, research issues, prepare bench memoranda, and observe judicial proceedings. Students will receive 3 credits in this program, and are expected to spend ten hours per week in chambers. Depending on the judge's needs, students may be assigned additional work or be asked to schedule their chambers hours on certain days or at certain times of day. In addition to chambers hours, the Honorable Sheila Woods-Skipper, Administrative Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia, Orphans Court Division and Judge Annette Rizzo (Ret.), will conduct a required classroom component focusing on current issues impacting the state courts. This seminar will meet at City Hall every Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (students can work in chambers Friday morning and Friday afternoon but will also need to complete additional hours on a second day).

Participation in this program. will be based on a selection process by a Law School Committee after review of your application and supporting materials (resume, writing sample, and statement of interest). Completion of this application constitutes your permission for the Committee to review your transcript. Should you be selected, you will be matched with a judge. Participating judges are all located in Philadelphia and are easily reached by car or public transportation.

Your application communicates your willingness to participate. You will not be permitted to drop this course once you are selected.

SELECTION CRITERIA

A student interested in participating in the State Court Honors Internship Program. must:

- **b**e a second-year day or third-year evening/part-time student;
- ♦ have a "B" average or better in the two semesters of LRW;
- submit the application, resume, writing sample, and a statement of personal interest by October 21, 2024 at 12 p.m. via e-mail to nurmson@temple.edu.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

The application form is attached. The final selection and assignment of judges will be made at the Committee's discretion no later than November 1, 2024 at 5 p.m. All decisions are final and, if selected, a student must accept the assignment.
