COMMUNITY LAWYERING CLINIC	Litigation and transactional matters for people with severe illnesses, such as cancer and HIV, and people with severe disabilities.	Prof. Spencer Rand	3 credits, pass/fail. Students can add the advanced clinic for 3 graded credits, either in the same semester or in a later semester. Seminar meets Tues 10-11:50.	Certification not required but may open other representation opportunities	10-12 hrs/wk including seminar.
FAMILY LAW LITIGATION CLINIC	Direct legal representation to low-income litigants in child custody, child and spousal support, adoption, and other family law matters	Prof. Sarah Katz	2-credit pass/fail clinic and 2-credit graded seminar. Meeting time TBD.	Certification required	8-10 hrs/wk in the office, usually over two days between M and Th. Additional hours for case preparation and court appearances as needed.
FEDERAL APPELLATE LITIGATION CLINIC	Representation to appellants in immigration appeals, habeas corpus proceedings, prisoner litigation, or similar matters pending in the US Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit.	Prof. Mary Levy	2-credit pass/fail clinic and 2-credit graded seminar.* Meeting time TBD.	3L and 4LE students only	10-12 hrs/wk including seminar.

LOW INCOME TAXPAYER CLINIC	Direct representation of taxpayers: under IRS audit; those contesting or are unable to pay tax amount proposed by the IRS; and with cases before the U.S. Tax Court. Also includes education and outreach to low income individuals and those that speak English as a second language and systemic advocacy projects.	Prof. Matthew James	2-credit pass/fail clinic and 2-credit graded seminar.* Meeting time TBD.	None	10-12 hrs/wk including seminar.
SOCIAL JUSTICE LAWYERING CLINIC	Individual representation and systemic advocacy projects, in collaboration with community and legal organizations, on behalf of low-wage workers and immigrants.	Prof. Jennifer Lee	2-credit graded seminar plus a 4-credit pass/fail clinic. Meeting time TBD.	Not required but certification is a plus	Average of 20 hrs/wk for all clinic work (assignments, seminar, supervision, client work, outside meetings).
SYSTEMIC JUSTICE CLINIC	Systemic advocacy in support of people affected by collateral consequences of criminal convictions, in partnership with community groups, social-service providers, and legal organizations.	Prof. Shanda Sibley	2-credit graded seminar and a 4-credit pass/fail clinic. Meeting time TBD.	No	15-18 hrs/wk for all clinic work, including seminar.
